SIR,

I have the honour to inform you that the League of Mercy has started a fund for the purpose of erecting monuments on the graves of British soldiers who fall on active service in this Protectorate.

2. The League of Mercy find that this duty is more costly than was at first anticipated and have applied for some financial assistance from Government.

3. I consider that this is a matter in which Government may with propriety take some share and recommend that a contribution of £100 be made from the Public Works Extraordinary vote of £8,100.
