Alterations have been made under Expenditure Head 9 - Post and Harbors, consequent upon the appointment of a new Post Officer, but the total of the expenditure under this Head remains unchanged.

At the time the appropriation Bill was introduced the total of expenditures was £1,186,647, and this amount was balanced by a similar amount of revenue. The result however of the alterations above detailed is that the total revenue is now estimated at £1,189,647 and the total of expenditures appearing in the Schedule to the Bill is reduced from £1,186,647 to £1,188,647.

I therefore urge that the sums appearing in the Schedule to the Bill against the following votes be deleted:

- 1. Treasury
- 2. Education
- 3. Military
- 4. Extraordinary Expenditure
- 5. Public Works Department
- 6. Public Works Extraordinary
- 7. Treasury Department
- and that these be substituted against
- 1. Treasury
- 2. Education
- 3. Military Department

Treasury's Statement in Committee [115]

the Appropriation Bill 1919.

Since the statement made on the introduction of the Appropriation Bill on the 16th of January last it has been necessary to make certain alterations affecting not only the details of some of the expenditure heads but also of the heads of revenue.

The Secretary of State considers that the estimate of \$8,000 from Reparations on Budget Soda Products cannot be relied on, and that this has accordingly been deducted from Revenue Head 12 - Sale of Government Property, as required by Law 1114. It appears very improbable that actual contributions can be received until sometime after the war is ended. The item for \$7,000 for Special Receipts from French property on France and Italy's part has therefore, under instructions from the Secretary of State, been deducted from Revenue Head 12 - Sale 1114 - this leaving a corresponding deduction of \$7,000 for new heads and charges under Budget Item Head 10 - Public Works Extra-

The total deductions from the estimated revenue amount to \$11,000, to account therefor will be the following deductions have been made under the appropriate heads:
