5. On the receipt of their letter he addressed a letter, copy of which is attached, to Messrs. Simeon and Company, and no reply having been received the bark was accordingly sold in December by the Uganda Railway together with other goods which had not been cleared.

6. The original owner of the cinnamon bark Mr. Alfred Berrian then appealed to me through the Governor of Seychelles in January after the sale had taken place - After consideration with my Executive Council, I ruled that cinnamon bark was not a foodstuff and that no restrictions should therefore be placed on its export. These instructions were acted on, but as far as Sikkim was concerned the bark had already been sold.

7. It will be observed that Messrs. L. Prageria and Company who were acting on behalf of Mr. Berrian, make no mention in their letter of the fact December to the Chief of Customs of the prohibition from shipping affecting their bark nor to deal with the movement, but that they complained in on altogether different grounds. My claim for compensation which Messrs. Berrian may bark, therefore, would apply to L.M. against the former firm and not against the Government of this Protectorate.

7. It will be observed that Messrs. J. Frigerio and Company who were acting on behalf of Mr. Beriou, make no mention in their letter of the law Decree to the effect of customs of the prohibition from shipping affecting their departure not to deal with the Government, but that they considered it on altogether different grounds. Any claim for compensation which Messrs. Beriou may have, therefore, would appear to lie against the former firm and not against the Government of this Protectorate.

In reply to your despatch No. 204 of May 20th
regarding cotton bank held by the Sultan of
Zanzibar I have the honour to report as follows:-

1. The cotton bank in question was imported
in two shipments as stated in my letter to
the Customs authorities at Zanzibar until December
when the Chief of Customs received a letter from
Messrs. Burgess and Company, who had been called upon
to accept all goods requiring to transit and tranship-
ment, stating that as they were unable to agree with
the cotton bank they were willing other instructions
from the owner, transmitting the following order to
Messrs. Burgess and Company.

2. He then called upon Messrs. L. Prigent
and Company, to clear the goods and to reply repudiated
a letter, copy of which is attached.
