Telegram. The Governor of the East-Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies. (Received, Colonial Office, 1.14 p.m. 28th June, 1915)

With reference to your telegram 25th June, East African Estates, no such arrangement has been made so far as I remember suggested and if it had been made I should not have agreed to. Payment of £50 rent should be strictly in accordance with terms of paragraph 1 (a) of clause 3 of draft lease sent with my covering despatch No. 842 of September 22 1914. Amount of rent paid is £1,000 to Crown Agents in 1911 in consideration of which the Company have had the use of considerable area up to the present time. There are no grounds for setting off any part of future liability against this payment.
