26 AUG 1915 COL OFFICE

Has been in East Africa 22 years with the exception of his leave which he has always taken when due.

17 years ago pains began in his left arm and got worse for 2 years when he resigned and went to India for 9 months.

He then got better and was reinstated. In August
1901 he got a sudden pain in his chest at night and ever
since then he has had pains which have gradually got
worse.

Three months ago was the first time he became unconscious during an attack.

He has had very little Malaria and 1 attack of dysentery this year no other illnesses.

He was admitted to Native Hospital on May 6 and has been under observation and treatment since.

He has had three very severe attacks of Angina pectoria and many slight ones.
