Re: Mr.N. E. Beckman Licensed Surveyor Claim for Food Your 11215/12 of the 29th June.

I have the honour to make the following remarks on Mr Beekman's letter of the 6th May forwarded under your memo quoted above.

In quoting the survey rates. Mr Beckman has emitted to mention that the rates apply only to country where the survey is, or ought to made by traverse, and that where made by triangulation the rates may be reduced by the Director of Surveys. The country under consideration was admirably suited to triangulation and this was the system of survey adopted by Mr Beckman.

Mr Galbraith reports that, for triangulation purposes, he would describe the country as open. I still maintain that Rs.8/- per 100 feet is a just rate for this work.

- (2) The fees granted for the work of Mr Beckman and Mr Kolbe was the the same, but Mr Brockway was paid at a higher rate as the work he carried out, entailed much greater labour.
- (8) As regards the rate for Mr Beckman's second piece of work, he is incorrect in stating that Mr Calbraith promised him Rs.10/- per 1000 feet all round

feet all round. Mr Galbraith's letter clearly stated the actual farms for which Mr Beckman would be paid at this rate.

The rates for the work of Surveyors on adjoining blocks were, in this case approximately the same as those granted to Mr Beckman.
