

**RAILWAY RATES EXPEDITIONARY FORCE  
ARMoured TRAIN**

States ammunition will be charged at ordinary Govt rates from 1st April. Question of other stores to stand over until end of war. Armoured train in use and not dismantled. Despatch follows.
