Sir,

I have the honour to refer to in Harcourt's Confidential despatch of June 19th 1918 relating to the retention of the export duty on wild rubber and to enquire whether the matter may now be reconsidered.

- 2. The present price of this product is not such as to render its export profitable under the duty payable, with the result that the object of attaining the maximum benefit from the Protectorate Forests in the shape of revenue, which was laid down as a guiding principle by your predecessor, is not achieved and a useful industry is completely strangled.
- 3. I would venture therefore to ask whether in view of the existing circumstances it would not be considered possible either to abolish the duty altogether until the trade improves or at least to reduce it to 4%.
- 4. I understand that the Governor of Uganda whose views on the subject entirely boincide with my own is addressing you in similar terms.
