 In confirmation of my telegram No. 286 of the 7th instant suggesting that, in view of the gifts made by Mr. H. B. Taylor for the benefit of military hospitals, no action should be taken on paragraph 4 of my despatch No. 499 of June 22nd recommending that he should be called upon to meet ~~some~~ and certain expenses incurred in bringing cooks from India I have the honour to report as follows.

2. Mr. Taylor has generously presented the whole of his wines, stores, poultry and livestock to the hospitals in question, the sum realized being approximately Rs. 1,700. In addition to this he has handed over the amount of

Rs.2,462.50 paid to him by Government for his motor car which was requisitioned at the beginning of the war.

3. His benefactions thus amount to nearly £300 and I would submit that in the circumstances it might appear somewhat ungracious to ask for a refund in the matter of the cooks. I should therefore be grateful for your authority to write off the sum of Rs.2,397.90 involved.
