The telegrams are obscure in two respects. (a) The notice carries (!) shall be 'Registration' advance. Do not really initiate compulsory service (passage under a first telegram). (b) It is to be assumed that the Registration advance now proposed applies to non-natives only & white Indian. Goance. But passage marked B in 2^d telegram makes this not quite certain.

I assume even so that the Govt intends first a registration law of non-natives.

Second to proceed on information so given to compulsory service of non-natives.

We show telegram to Governor (a) asking if this assumption is correct (b) approving (if true).

I will have written to Selig - with it say to askward from the moment but we cannot afford to delay this decision & enthusiasm.

I would however not publish through the Press Bureau at present even tho' the news may now (at the Public sitting) be likely to come out.

Telegram: The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 12 a.m. 11th September, 1915.)

September 10th. I am requested to transmit for your information following resolution which was unanimously and enthusiastically passed on September 5th at mass meeting of Nairobi citizens estimated at 1500 in number begins. That this meeting believing that the administrative professional industrial commercial and military resources of this Protectorate should be organized in their entirety on a war footing and realizing that no sufficiently comprehensive is possible without the extension to all citizens of the principle of universal service already initiated by the native carriers ordinance does hereby ask for such extension of the principle of universal service and unreservedly places its members and their resources at the disposal of His Excellency the Governor and Commander in Chief the better to enable him to maintain the country's due part in the immense task which besets our King and peoples. (ends) Meeting was composed of all sections of European Indian and Goanese communities. Resolution was proposed by Captain Grogan seconded by Captain Russell Bowker and supported by Mr Naraindas on behalf of Indians and Mr Campos on behalf of Goanese. Indians and Goanese sent delegates duly appointed at preceding meetings to represent all sections of Asiatic community. Telegrams and letters were read in support from Officer Commanding adjutant officers and men of the East African mounted rifles Captain Honourable Berkeley Cole Lord Cranworth Reverend W. Low Mr Frank Watkins and many other prominent settlers. I am entirely in accordance with the sentiments expressed and steps are being taken to give them effect.
