## ENCLOSURE

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY AMENDMENT BILL, 1915.STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of the Bill to amend the law relating to Trading with the enemy is to enact the amendments to the Trading with the Enemy Ordinance, 1915 suggested in Colonial Office No. 281 of the 21st April 1915. Section 1 (2) (a) of the Principal Ordinance was drafted in order that the Governor might at once be in a position to meet any particular phase of the subject which might occur in the Protectorate. The original intention was to adopt the royal Proclamations on the subject of trading with the enemy by a Governor's proclamation under the ordinance. The amendment proposed by the Secretary of State of adding a definition of the word "Proclamation" so as to include royal Proclamations is, however, in my opinion free from objection and in some ways preferable.

The other amendment, with the exception of one, proposed by the Secretary of State are to smooth away inequalities in drafting due to the somewhat hasty consolidation in the Ordinance of the provisions of the Trading with the Enemy Act 1914 and the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act 1914.

3. The amendment to Section 4 arises from a printer's error.

4. The last two sections of the Bill are to provide the necessary legal machinery for the liquidation of

the property of enemy subjects carrying on business in the Protectorate. The Secretary of State has intimated by cable that it is his intention to liquidate enemy firms and it is in my opinion desirable that such liquidation should be conducted under legal authority.

3. In view of the urgent necessity for the provisions dealing with liquidating enemy firms having regard to the approaching arrival of the liquidator sent from home the Ordinance may, in my opinion, be assented to without prior reference to the Secretary of State.
