- Company or Squadron Supt 8 - 10/-*
- Supt 7 - 7 1/4*
- Corporal 6 - 9/-*
- 1st Corporal 5 - 6/-*
- Private 4 - 7/-*

*This is a Corporal's pay which is less than the Army Pay of a 2nd Lieut (7 5/8)*

*But 2nd Lieut's pay is not I think as point - Local Officers are Subalterns (if not Captains or higher) and when invalided would count as full Lieutenants (7 5/8) Corporals, etc. Therefore a Corporal is as well paid as they are by the Govt*

*We have had no invalided warrant since 1860 so no question has arisen before. But my feeling is that*

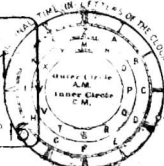
