Mr. Rand,

The above paragraph will serve to explain  
why I kept this. The more general questions about  
n.e.o.s. (more particularly West Africa arose at  
the same time as this letter and have only  
recently been disposed of, so far as we are concern-  
ed, it is enough to say that the principle of  
liability for K.A.R. n.e.o.s. in the U.A.P. has been  
accepted.

As regards the way in which the contributions are  
to be paid, I see that in the case of U.A.P. we  
tell the U.A.P. to make the necessary arrangements in the  
case of the n.e.o.s. and we had better follow the  
same course now.

I could not find that any arrangement has been  
made in the case of officers, and it will be best  
to tell the Govr. to attend to it.

Sir,

I am commanded by the Army Council to refer to your letter of the 19th ultimo No. 3940/1914, and to acquaint you that they concur in Mr. Harcourt's proposal that the arrangements for the payment of a contribution towards the retired pay of a British Army Officer in the service of a Colonial Government should, in the case of the East Africa Protectorate, take effect from the 1st April 1914. No contribution will be claimed in respect of an Officer already in the service of the Protectorate at that date, unless the original term of his appointment is subsequently extended or he suffers a change of status, when the contribution would at once become payable. The Council note, however, that Mr. Harcourt approves of a contribution being paid exceptionally in respect of Captain E. M. F. King, Royal Engineers, whose appointment to the Survey Department of the East Africa Protectorate is dated the 26th March last.

The Council also agree that the same date, 1st April, 1914, should be fixed for the arrangements for a pension contribution in respect of Non-Commissioned Officers of the British Army to be brought into effect in the East Africa Protectorate.
