

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch No. 500 of the 17th of August on the subject of the reported damage done by the enemy to the Magadi Railway.

2. The facts are as stated by Messrs. Pauling & Co. in their letter of the 30th of June. The damage occurred on the 10th of May, and the cost of repairs, including the materials supplied, was as follows:-

4 Fish plates	7. 24
