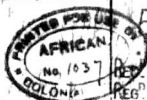

Re: Professor Simpson's Report.

(1) With reference to your No. S. 9813/100 dated 5th July 1915 forwarding copy of despatch No. 352 dated 20th May from the Colonial Office.

(2) The following works enumerated in His Excellency The Governor's despatch No. 251 dated March 25th 1915 should be deleted from any programme contemplated:-

Para. 2, clause 61 b. - A special barge and disinfecting apparatus as the present mode of disinfection seems adequate.

Para. 2, clause 61 c. - The replacement of the present rafts by larger ones, as the working radius of the ships' derricks would be materially affected.

Para. 2, clause 63 - Cement grouting of stone pitching, as the method proposed is impracticable, and the cost of replacing the open wharf by a concrete wall would be prohibitive.

(3) The following works should be carried out in the order enumerated, as funds permit:-

Clause 157:

Fitting pumps and moving water tanks on S.S. "Clement Hill" & "Winifred"

approximate cost Re. 4,000

Clause 64:

- (a) Concrete floors for shed and wharfs Rs. 21,000
- (b) Goods Shed Station Yard 2,500
- (c) Concrete floor in Marine Workshop 7,500
- (d) Cementing drains under roadways 2,000
- (e) Fixing C.I. sheets to uneliminable fence round Customs Yard 3,400
- (f) Making Marine Yard fence rat proof 1,000

Wire netting is being gradually provided at all buildings, and the Marine Store can be made rat proof.

Clause 152:

The installation of electric fans for the Officers' cabins can be undertaken as soon as funds are available.
