Fe Attempt to wreak train at mile 192/17 -27th A. ril 1915.

I have the honour to inform you that an attempt was pade to wrec, a sive ttock a setal Prain at File 192/17 at 1:40.pm on the 27th instant.

A live fured bomb was placed on the small oulvert at Mile 192/17, but fortunately did not explode until after the train had passed over it. The damage done was very slight, and traffic was practically uninterrupted.

The enemy opened a rario fire on the train, killing two natives and wounding five natives and two mules, The fire was directed at a height of two or three feet shows the floors of the carriages and wagons. One bullet went through the oab of the loognotive but fortunately did not hit anyone.

It would almost appear that it was an attempt to blow up a certain known train, and not an indiscriminate attempt at damaging the line or rolling stock.

The driver, on heing fired on, put on hall steam and not the train out of the danger some.

Aurthor to my litter so. A 8, 1:0, 313, 1:ted the 29th April last, I have the honour to give particulars of the various attempts made on the daily by the enemy:-

At 1.30 a.m. on the dru June an up special goods train ran over an enemy mine place; under the rall at Mile 239/17. The engine Mo. 114 (Mailet type) although damaged did not leave the track, but a portion of the line having been blown away by the explosion resulted in the complete derailment of the 8th vehicle, covered bogie wagon mo. 2306, on the train. Mores of the train staff were injured.

No. 17 up goods train ran over a Mine at Mile 79/16, at 0.45 a.m. on the 23rd July.
