Extract from letter to Naval Commander in Chief
by the Governor of German East Africa dated 11th
October, 1915.

I am glad to be able to give you information as
to the health of the Prisoners of War in the Protect-
orate.

Considering the climate the health of the
Prisoners of War is, in general, good: though Mr. Reed
(Prospector) is very ill with disease of the lungs.
I am sorry to say that since the 7th of June Captain
Cleaver (Clever) and Lieutenant Cooke (Cook) have
died of their wounds, as I have already reported to
His Excellency the Governor in Nairobi by letter on
the 20th August, 1915. In reply to the General Officer
Commanding in British East Africa and Uganda I beg
that you will be good enough to inform him that Lieut:
Williams is well and that you will also communicate
the above information to him.

I shall be most grateful for an early communication
as to the health of the German Prisoners of War in
India, and also for the lists of Prisoners previously
given to be completed as requested in my letter of the
7th of June, 1915.
