THE NATIVE REGISTRATION AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1915.

STATEMENT OF OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The Native registration amendment Ordinance, 1915, has been introduced primarily to amend several printer's errors which appeared in the Native Registration Ordinance, 1915, as enacted but which were not present in the Bill as passed. They are the errors corrected in Section 2 (1) and (2) of the amending Bill. As the first of such errors is of vital bearing on the construction of the Bill it has been considered advisable in order to avoid any possibility of dispute to deal with them by an amending Ordinance at the same time taking the opportunity of adopting the suggestions afforded by the criticisms of the Native Registration Ordinance, 1915, by the Secretary of State vide his No. 616 of the 19th August, 1915 on sections 10 and 11.

2. The Bill may, in my opinion, be assented to without reference home.
