Arrangements are being made for all vessels of this line to call at a port in U.K. on both outward & homeward voyages. No further action appears to be necessary.

this is satisfactory as far as the
general question of the Thoresen line
is concerned, but we are left
with two enquiries addressed to
us in 39346 and 39530.

(1) 39346. The protest of the Union
Carrie line is directed against
vessels of the Thoresen line being
allowed to carry chrome ore from
Rhodesia to Norway and large
tonnage real British vessels are
not used for this purpose.

Our action in arranging shipping
has been purely administrative, and

the decision in the matter rests
with the Admiralty. I think the
U.C. Co must have some answer,
and I suppose we must again
draw the admr's attention to his
enclosure to our letter to them of
6 Sept. and ask them either to
send a reply to the Co. direct
to let us know what reply they
will be sent.


