First I must inform you that my address will be till further notice the above.

Re your letter I was not aware that money I received from Nairoti was my monthly allowance. I must tell you that for the first three months my husband volunteered I never received the penny till after you sent me 210, then I received 213, 6, 8. which was not the full amount for two months. Mr. Gradwell at that time had been serving since the declaring of War. Your money arrived on Nov. 4, if I am right in the date, and shortly after the other arrived from Africa. I can't understand why my allowance is suspended for one month when there is money due to me from the time war was declared. never got any money for three months; I was living on strangers consequently and I am just clearing off that debt. My baby has been ill with bronchitis; there is the doctor to pay yet and the chemist for his medicine.
