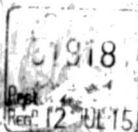

Sir,

With reference to your letter No. 25015/1915 of the 5th June requesting us to submit the names of suitable candidates for appointment as Deputy Chief Storekeeper, Uganda Railway, East Africa Protectorate, I have the honour to enclose an extract from a letter which we have received from Mr. Eastwood, the General Manager of the Uganda Railway, in which he recommends the appointment of Mr. B.H. Carter who is at present employed as Depot Storekeeper on the Beira and Mashonaland and Rhodesian Railways, Beira. Mr. Carter's letter of application is enclosed in original for return. We have of course not seen Mr. Carter himself, nor the originals of the testimonials attached to his application but we have communicated with his employers by telegraph enquiring whether he could be recommended for the post and have received a reply in the affirmative, and in the circumstances we advise that he should be offered the appointment.

Gentlemen,

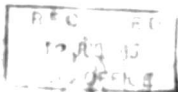
