# Agreement

made the twenty-first day of August One thousand nine hundred and fifteen Between the Crown, Agents for the Colonies London acting on behalf of the Governments of the British Protectorates in Eastern Africa and Ernest Adams of Glenthorne Palace Road Crouch End London in the County of Middlesex (hereinafter called the person engaged)

- 1 In this Agreement the term "Protectorate" shall mean the Protectorate in which the person engaged is for the time being performing his duties and the term "Government" shall mean the Government of that Protectorate
- 2 The person engaged agrees to proceed on the first instance to the East Africa Protectorate and thereafter to such other Protectorates in Eastern Africa as may be directed from time to time by the Government and undertakes that he will for the term of his engagement diligently and faithfully perform such duties as may be required of him in connection with the winding up of the businesses of His Excellencies or such other suitable duties as the Government may call upon him to perform. While the person engaged is in any Protectorate he shall reside in such place and occupy himself in such manner as the Government through its duly authorized officers shall direct and he shall not either directly or indirectly engage or be concerned in any other service or business whatsoever or receive commissions

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a period of my bond I shall devote the whole  
of his time and attention to the service of the  
Government and shall use his utmost exertions  
to promote the interests of the Government.

3. The salary of the officer is at the rate of  
seventy pounds (£70) per calendar month  
and shall be payable from the date of  
embarkation on first engagement until the  
day of disembarkation from the steamer  
by which the person engaged would first  
be able to reach England on the termination  
of his duties except as provided in  
Clauses 8, 9 and 10.

In the case of any outward voyage  
from England via Marseilles the day  
of embarkation shall be taken to be the  
day on which the person engaged is  
required to leave England in order to  
catch the steamer, and in the case of  
any voyage to England via Marseilles the  
day of disembarkation shall be taken to  
be the day after the date of arrival at  
Marseilles of the steamer by which the  
person engaged travels.

In the case of any voyage to England  
via the Cape of Good Hope the day of  
disembarkation shall be taken to be  
the day of arrival of the steamer at  
its first port of call in the United  
Kingdom.

4. The term of the engagement of the  
person engaged is such period not  
exceeding twelve months as may be  
necessary for the completion of  
the duties for which he is required

The person engaged shall be provided with  
free single furnished quarters or an allowance  
in lieu.

When travelling on duty away from  
his station in the Protectorate the person  
engaged either shall be provided with  
transport or shall be paid travelling  
expenses according to the scales laid  
down for transport and travelling expenses  
respectively in the Protectorate.

(1) "Passage" in this agreement means  
a first-class passage and includes conveyance  
by railway, steamer or other transport between  
the port of disembarkation and the station  
of the person engaged in the Protectorate  
and conveyance by railway on the Continent  
of Europe where necessary.

(2) The Government shall provide the person  
engaged with a free passage to East  
Africa and with such conference passages  
or travelling facilities between the  
Protectorates as may be necessary and  
with a passage back to England  
on the satisfactory expiration of the  
engagement provided that he claims  
and avails himself of such passage  
within two months of the termination  
of his duties.

If the person engaged shall be compelled  
by reason of ill-health not caused by his  
own misconduct to resign his appointment  
it shall at any time be certified  
by a duly qualified medical officer  
employed by the Government that he is  
incapable on physical grounds of rendering

further official service in the Protectorate, the Government shall pay him full salary up to but not including the date of departure of the first steamer by which, in the opinion of the Government he could have embarked, and half salary during the time necessarily spent on the passage to England and shall provide him with a free passage to England provided he embarks within two months of the date of such recognition or certificate, but he shall have no further claim on the Government. A certificate issued by a duly qualified medical officer employed by the Government shall be conclusive evidence on the question whether or not the person engaged was compelled to resign his office by reason of ill health within the meaning of this clause.

If the person engaged shall at any time neglect or refuse or from any cause (excepting ill health not caused by his own misconduct as provided in Clause 8) become unable to perform any of his duties or to comply with any order or shall divulge any information respecting the affairs of the Government to any persons not in the employment of the Government or shall in any manner misconduct himself the Government may dismiss him and in such case all rights and advantages received to him by his Agreement shall cease and he shall be liable to repay on demand the amount paid for his passage to East Africa on first engagement.

The Government may at any time determine the engagement of the person engaged by giving him three months notice of ceasing it, on paying him one month's salary and in either

case if he is on the Protectorate at the time terminating him with a free passage to England provided that he claims and avails himself of such return passage within six months of the termination of the engagement.

The person engaged may at any time after the expiration of three months from the commencement of any residential service and while serving in the Colony determine his engagement on giving to the Government three months' notice in writing or on paying to the Government one month's salary and in either case repaying the cost of his passage to East Africa. He shall not in either case be entitled to a return passage to England.

The person engaged shall if so required by the Government furnish such security as the Government may decide upon for the faithful and honest discharge of his duties and any premium payable in respect of such security may be deducted from his salary by the Government.

In the event of the person engaged being entitled on the expiration of this agreement to any payment in England before payment can be made it will be necessary for him to produce to the Crown Agents a certificate from the Government of the amount so due.

When the person engaged is not in the Colony the Crown Agents for the Colonies who are duly authorized by the Government or by the Secretary of State for the Colonies shall be
