With reference to your letter, 31384/1914, of the 13th September last, regarding emigration from Somaliland to Jubaland, I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to transmit to you, herewith, a copy of a despatch from His Majesty's Ambassador at Rome on the subject.

Sir E. Grey concurs in the proposal made by the Italian Government to authorise the Governments of British East Africa and Italian Somaliland to effect the necessary arrangement by an exchange of notes; and I am to enquire whether Mr. Secretary Harcourt agrees to this course being adopted.

Sir,

With reference to your despatch No. 344 of September 15 1914 I have the honour to transmit to you herewith translation of a Note which I have received from the Italian Government agreeing in principle to the conclusion of an Agreement between the Italian and the British Governments for the regulation of the emigration movement from Somaliland to Jubaland and suggesting that such agreement should be embodied in an exchange of Notes between the Governments of Britain and Italian Somaliland.

In the note of September 22nd last, Your Excellency was good enough to ask me whether the Royal Government would be disposed to sign an agreement which is occasioned by cases of emigration from Somaliland to Jubaland, to conclude an agreement on this subject with the British Government.

My colleague of the Colonies whose favourable examination of the matter I have invited informs me that the migration of Somalis into British territory on the right bank of the river Juba takes place in two distinct ways:

a. in the passage of smaller groups and individuals to the south of Bardera and specially in Gobola. This is primarily a movement of an economic nature.

b. in the periodical transmigration of considerable ethnical groups which, crossing the High Banan and Daga from the region North of the Nebi Makhelli, transfer themselves to the territories of Jubaland and of the Karchan district, a transmigration which

is principally occasioned by family ties with the Cahila and of the existing interests between the Ugadan and the Abban, who occupy the Southern territories of Ethiopia bordering on the Italian colony.

On the basis of the above-mentioned facts I should find no difficulty in coming to an agreement for the regulation of the above-named emigration movement in the region of the river Juba, which goes from the Corei mountains to the river-mouth, provided the British Government are prepared on their side to assure their effective co-operation against the perpetual attempts at incursion which the Woredan of the right bank make when the river is low against our populations on the left bank.

As however it is a question of prescribing measures based on purely local requirements and convenience, which may on that account need modification from time to time in their application, it would be more advantageous that the agreement should be drawn up between the Governors of the British Colony and Italian Somaliland by means of an exchange of notes under authorisation from the respective Governments. I have the honour to beg Your Excellency to inform me of the views of the "British Government on the question of arriving myself on (such) a date".
