Monsieur le Secrétaire d'Etat -

J'ai l'honneur de faire savoir à Votre Excellence qu'une batterie de 4 canons de montage de 90 mm. Saint Ramond destinée aux troupes belges de campagne au Kivu vient d'être envoyée dans la colonie par la voie Mombassa-Entebbe-Pitangira.

Le Capitaine Commandant Boulaert, auquel le commandement de cette batterie a été confié quittera Marseille le 29 Avril et se trouvera vers le 2 Mai à Entebbe où il devra procéder à une première organisation de sa batterie. Il devra ensuite assurer le transport de celle-ci avec matériel, accessoires, outillage et munitions vers le nord du Lac Kivu par la voie la plus rapide qui est, semble-t-il, la route Entebbe, S'Barara, Rutshuru.

En vue de faciliter ce transport le Ministre des Colonies s'est adressé au Major Leggett, Directeur du 'British East Africa Company' pour obtenir si possible une soixantaine de mules et au minimum de 20 à 30 de ces animaux. Les mules devraient être réunies à Entebbe à la disposition du Commandant Boulaert qui les achèterait pour compte de la colonie.

Monsieur Renkin a demandé également au Major Leggett de faire rechercher soit au Lac Victoria, soit à Mombassa, deux canots à moteur capables de porter une mitrailleuse et

TELEGRAM. The Secretary of State for the Colonies to the  
Governor of the East Africa Protectorate.

(Sent 6.45 p.m. 3rd May, 1915.)

May 3rd.

Belgian authorities state that Captain  
Commandant Moulart left Marseilles April 29th for  
Mombasa in order to take command of a battery of four  
mountain guns, which together with accessories and  
ammunition he will organize at Entebbe about May  
20th. Thence he will transport the battery to the  
Lake Kivu District via M'Barara and Rutshuru.

Please inform Governor of Uganda in order  
that everything possible may be done to facilitate  
transport etc. of these military stores.
