I have been instructed by my government to bring the following facts to the notice of Your Excellency.

On October 2nd, 1914 the acting Notherland Consul at Sombassa, Mr. K. Krulder and another Setherland subject ir. A. Winkelman residing at the town where taken prisoner by the local police authorities of British East Africa. No resson whatever " was a given for this arbitrary proceeding on the part of the British authorities, and the repeated requests of Mr. Krulder as well as of Mr. Winkelm to be taken before the magistrate in order to defend themselves against the charges brought against them, remained vithout any shever. When asked by the provincial comissioners Mr. Hemsted, whether he was acting consultafor the Netherlands Mr. Brulder confirmed such; the temporary transfer of the compular affairs to him having been communicated to the same acting Provincial Commissioner by official letter of July 18, 1914. The two gentlemen continued to be kept in the severest seclusion and every request

The imprisonment lasted until November 4th, when they were released after the personal interference of Mr. Ryken, the representative of the "Dentraal-Afrikaanscha".

Mr. Kruider was ordered to leave Mombases immediately and he was not allowed to settle his affairs for which he had asked permission, not even to close his house.

In bringing this to Your Excellency's notice, I have been instructed to draw Your Excellency's special attention to the fact that:

- 1) by the errest of Mr. Krulder, acting consul for the Netherlands, the consular post at Mombassa had to remain during a long tems without any occupant and Mr. Krulder was not allowed to settle his affairs before being taken to prison.
- 2) Confirming to the elementary principles of law, the prison or who until this date ignore the reasons of their detention were not heard.
- 3) when released no satisfaction shatever has been given to the prisoners.

4) the griconary were never allowed to get into any communi-

communications neither with their Government nor with the representatives of that Government abroad.

The fact that Mesers. Krulder and Winkelman were re leased as soon as Mr. Rykan had interfered on their behalf, indicates that their imprisonment sould not be justified by any valid reasons and as both the gentlemen assure that they never gave the slightest reason for the proceedings of which they have been the victime. Her Majesty's Government would feel obliged if the British Government would order an investigation to be made and they feel confident that eventually Your Excellency will be good enough to give some expression of your regrets, if such investigation might prove the innocence of the two Netherland subjects. Especially for Mr. Winkelman; who continues to live in Mombases and who by the action of the police authorities has been practically estracised, an expression of Your Excellency's opinion, if it be such, that no grounds of suspicion ressin against him, would be of vital importance.
