REC 16 DECEMBER 12th, 1918.

In consideration of His Majesty's Government consenting to the shipment to us of Mangrove bark or Wattle Bark from British Africa & Jamaica, we hereby give the following undertaking, which shall remain in force so long as Great Britain shall war.

We undertake not to dispose of any Mangrove Bark or Wattle Bark which we may import from British Possessions, Protectorates or Protected States or Tanning Districts made herefrom otherwise than by sale to manufacturers in the United States or Canada who will use them solely for their own manufacturing purposes.

We undertake not to export directly or indirectly to enemy countries or to neutral countries in Europe or to sell to others without satisfying ourselves that they will not export or sell for export directly or indirectly to such countries any other materials for tanning or dressing of leather which may be in or may come to our possession.
