I have the honour to enclose herewith a petition addressed to Your Lordship by Milkhi Ram, late Yard Foreman in this Administration.

2. The facts of the case are as follows :-

Milkhi Ram was engaged with this Administration from the 8th August 1915 to the 20th December 1924, when he resigned. In 1925 he applied for re-employment and was re-engaged with effect from 1st August 1925 as an Assistant Fard Foreman. In February, 1928, he made application for a special increment, and intimated that it this could not be granted he wished to resign. The increment was not granted, and his resignation was accepted on 14th February, 1928, at one month's notice and he was informed that he would be paid up to and for 15th March.

Prior to the receipt of the notice of resignation certain information was received by the Railway Administration which necessitated a lengthy investigation by the Railway Police, and it was only on the 13th March, 1928, that the enquiries were finished and the case against Milkhi Ram was complete. On this date he was arrested for offences committed during the period.....
