

TELEGRAM from the Governor of Kenya to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Dated 1st December, 1931.

Following from Asian Civil Service Association Begins. Staff painfully disappointed to learn local Government does not propose to grant retrenched Asian Officials proportionate pension for less than 7 years service and other concessions made during 1922/23 retrenchment under Secretariat Circular 58 of 1922. It is respectfully submitted that the plight of these officials who accepted Government service as a career relying on its permanency is most pitiable and merits more generous treatment. Six months notice not much helpful owing world wide unprecedented unemployment situation Ordinance 11 of 1927 grants confirmed European officers pension on retrenchment irrespective of service and besides embodying climatic allowance also provides for pension on monthly basis. We understand latter concession applies to Asian staff in Zanzibar. My Association respectfully appeals for sympathetic consideration of question of expediting the enactment of pension legislation for Asians and of granting to retrenched officials the other concessions prayed for. Would be most grateful if decision cabled. Our Association prepared pay cost. Ends.

TELEGRAM from the Governor of Kenya to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

No. 37. Confidential. By telegram No. 302. Asian pensioners.

I am unable to agree that necessity exists for grant of pensions on retrenchment to Asians holding permanent and pensionable posts who have not completed qualifying period of 10 years and such officers are being treated in accordance with the provisions of section 102 of the ~~106~~ Code of Regulations. Other non-pensionable staff have been treated in accordance with section 105. In this connection see correspondence terminating with my despatch of the 1st November Confidential No. 172. Paragraph 5 of my despatch of the 13th October Transport No. 109 shows Government practice of paying gratuities to retrenched pensionable clerks of five years service and I strongly urge that existing Regulations in this regard should not be altered.

Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Mr. Thomas' Confidential despatch of the 17th October, 1951, on the subject of the enactment of pension legislation for Asian Officers.

2. I am confident an attempt to introduce legislation of this nature at the forthcoming session would seriously embarrass Government and I welcome the suggestion that further consideration should be postponed for not more than six months.

3. You will have observed that in paragraph 27 of the Report of the Terms of Service Committee enclosed in my Despatch No. 614 of the 25th October, 1951, a reference is made to an inquiry into a Local Service for Asian Civil servants.

4. Copies of this despatch are being sent to the neighbouring Governments.

No. 74 Confidential. Following from Kenya Asian Civil Service Association begins. Most grateful for early reply to our telegram of November question of pensions to retrenched confirmed Asian officials less than 10 years service. Officials retrenched these being given pension by neighbouring Governments but not Kenya. Afraid that date of introduction of pension Ordinance may not cover these cases. Recoverable ends.

4. (e)(f) & (g) of the annexure to no. 3 on 17/43/C/31 purport to show the terms on which Colony Asian servants have been entrenched. These terms are:

(e) Asians confined to admitted to permanent pensionable establishment - 6 months' notice to run concurrently with any leave earned & to include voyage period to India (if eligible to voyage).

(f.) Asians serving on probation in permanent establishment not confined or made pensionable 1 month's notice to any leave earned on full pay.

(g) Asian clerks on temporary basis — one month's notice.

5. I gather from that:

(ii) ~~pensionable~~ Asian who have at completed 10 years service get

(a) gratuity of 1/2 1 month's pay for each year of service — as in para 3 above.

(b) 6 months' ~~notice~~ with full pay — as in 4(e) above.

(iii) Non-pensionable Asian who have served for 7 years or more get

(a) gratuity of 1/2 or 1 week's pay for each year of service — as in para 3 above.

(b) 1 month's notice & any leave earned on full pay.

(iii). Non-pensionable Asians who have not served for 7 years or more get

(a) no gratuity

(b) 1 month's notice & any leave earned on full pay.
