No.326 of the 21st October, 1931, regarding the voluntary retirement of Asian staff and to inform you that Mr.George Taylor, an African serving on Asian terms of service as a 2nd Grade Glerk in the Provincial Administration, has intimated his desire to retire voluntarily under the terms of the telegram in queetion. His application has been accepted.

2. Hr.Taylor who was originally engaged as an Interpreter on the 16th June, 1914, was subsequently employed as a Hut Counter and was finally transferred to the clerical establishment on the lat April, 1918. He now requests that his service from the original date of his appointment may be allowed to count for pension.

3. As his services have been continuous, and in view of Eard Passfield's despatch No.774 of the Srd of October, 1929, I resonated that Er-Taylor's request may be granted and that for purposes of pension his services may be allowed to count from the 16th June, 1914.

I shall be glad to learn that my recommendation meets with your approval.
