I, T.C.Mascarenhas, Special Grade Clerk in the Postal Department, have the honour to humbly and respectfully submit the following claim for your kind configuration.

2. In the year 1907 after a sewere attack of black water fever at Kisumu ff was granted four months extension of leave in India without pay. I was made aware of the fact that this period of sick leave would not count for pension only a few days before my departure on retipement from the service as it would appear the Department had no information on the subject.

7. A request to the Hom. the Fostmaster General mede a few days before I left Nairobi, that a recommendation be made to Government for an extension of my tour by at least four months or alternatively that the period be allowed to count for pension was not granted on the grounds that I had already received consideration in as much as I had been allowed to remain till January 1932 instead of leaving the service in Movember 1931, as was the original intention of the Postmaster General.

4. The facts in this connection are that early in the latter part of last year I was moved to provided on leave before I had completed the normal tournings my last return from leave, in order, I presume, that I should be retired from the service at the close of 1931 on account of the economy steps the Government was then taking to ease the financial depression.

. 5

- other obvious reasons it was not possible for me to do so immediately at that time, and was called upon to submit a medical report. On this being done arrangements were taken in hand to secure passages for me and family to proceed to India in November but no accomodation was available until January of this year.
- 6. If this may be called a consideration in the case of one who has served the Government for more than 52 years I would respectfully submit that it was not of such importance or magnitude as not to have allowed me the further benefit of a small extension, by the refusal of which I am now to be deprived of a small, but for me a very essential and important, increase in my pensionable empluments.
- 7. I joined and herved in the Colony in its very early days, often under considerable herdship and discomfort and without the many privileges that are granted to Officera in these days.

 As a direct result of very unhealthy conditions then prevailing I sufferred un attack of black water fever, which at the end of a long and faithful service is new to penalise me for no fault of mine.
- 8. In view of the foregoing I pray that you, Sir, will give this petition of mine your very kind consideration and grant me a last favour by directing that my service from June 1899 to June 1992 (when my leave as at present is due to expire), i.e., 33 years, may be counted an continuous or alternatively to extend my leave by the number of months required to complete a full year of pensionable service as a special case.
- 9. Whilst the granting of my request would perhaps be of very little consequence to dovernment and could not create any undesirable precedence, as cases like mine will warely if ever occur, it would mean a boom to me and a matisfaction by way of

a small reward in a tangible form for the many years of labour so zealously and ungrudgingly given in the service of the Government, and which I have been practically forced to leave owing to retrenchment of expenditure.

Forwarded. The applicant is Mr. T.O. Mascarenhas, Registration and Insurance Clark of this Department, who is now on leave penning retirement. Secretarist file 3/Ret. 19/1/593/38 refers.

E. Briefly, the circumstances preceding Mr. Mascarenhas' retirement were that, in connection with the attaining of the age of 50 which he did on 18th February, 1981, and completing nearly 38 years service, he was referred to and intimated that he wished to retire on completion of his then current tour. Later, on the 19th June, he was informed that, in view of the genomic position, the Department would prefer that he should advance the date of his retirement so so to permit of his appointment hecoming vacant engly in 1982. He put for ward rarious representations, chierly relating to his denvite directes tances, with the result that the legarinest spread to his department on leave, (print to retirement), being postponed to the sorth James, 1962, and Mr. Masoarenhas in a written sinute, expressed his appreciation or the considera-tion extended to him. His statement that he need asked to remain until January 1992 is not in Assordance with Tact.

nents for his departure and retirement that twen completed, Mr. Mascarsuhas reported that the fact that a menta tear without pay granted in 1903 would not count for pension had, "essaped his attention" and enquired whether his departure could be postposed 4 months or, alternatively, whether the postposed 4 months or, alternatively, whether the department would recommend that this period might be permitted to count-for pension. at the time he stated verbally that, whilst demiring to assure the Department's attitude on the setter, he did not wish to press either alternative. It is not correct to suggest that the Department was not aware of the no-pay leave position.

As there was argent need for seconomy, he was informed that the Department was not, in view of the consideration already extended to him, preto agree to his departure being again . He was informed at the same time, or had nothing to do with the provious consideration extended to him, that it could not be arranged (i.e. departmentally), to allow the 4 months no-pay period to count for pension. To this intimation he did not then desur5. Mr. Massarenhas is an officerwho has rendered long and valuable service to the Department but it must not be overlooked that for this he was rewarded by presention to a Special Grade post at Sha. 600/- per memeas and that his pension will correspondingly benefit. Had he gone at the time it was originally intended he should go, there could have been no question of allowing him a special concession in order to complete a year for pension purposes. In fact, the consideration which was extended to him by the Department is now being used as a lever to obtain that concession. His grievamee, if any, lies, I think, in the fact that Asiatic pensions are not calculated on a monthly instead of on a yearly heats. The Department is not prepared to recommend that Mr. Massarenhas' present leave should be extended by four menths but, if it is felt that his case merits consideration, perhaps the question of the 1905 leave being allowed to count as service for pension purposes might be examined. The only regulation which appears to have a possible bearing on the matter is that given in Section 5d of the European Officers' Pension Officers in laws without makery granted on grounds of public policy and with the approval of the Secretary of State being allowed to count for pension. A copy of the minute approving for Massarenhas' 4 months maps leave in 1905 - the period under sensitieration is attached.

6. The penaton already approved for Mr. Engagemhas is at the rate of Mas. 4, 41.6/- per annua and this would be increased by She. 186/- per annua if the 1903 no per period is added to remaintable service.

I forward herewith memorandum No. "E" 885/09 of SErd February, 1988 from the Fostmaster General, together with the uselowares thereto.

Mr.Mesourenhas hompleted 80 years,8 months and 1 day pensionable service and his pension was, therefore, calculated on 80 years service. As the extension of leave without malary in 1908 was not granted on the grounds of public policy, that period cannot be allowed to count for pension purposes, and the Decretary of State has ruled that leave say not be extended for the purpose of increasing an officer's pensionable service.
