Gentlemen,

I have to refer to Sir Frederick Palmer's letter of the 4th August addressed to Colonel Fleming regarding the retaining fee which should be paid to you for advisory work in connection with the Kenya & Uganda Railway.

The suggestion that your annual retaining fee should be reduced from £500 to £100 per annum was forwarded to the Colonial Office, who submitted it to the High Commissioner for Transport. The High Commissioner has, however, now expressed the wish that payment of any retaining fee should be discontinued from the 1st. January 1933, and that a definite fee should be paid for any special work that may in future be referred to you. This is the arrangement which now exists with regard to our Consulting Engineers for Harbour Works in Kenya which, as you are aware, form a part of the organisation of the Railway Department.

3. We regret exceedingly that it should be necessary to alter the arrangement between your firm and the Kenya and Uganda Railway which has existed since its inception. We realise how much the Railway owed in its earlier years to the ability of Sir Alexander Rendel and we fully appreciate the value of the services which your firm have rendered over so many years. You will of course understand that this alteration will in no way affect any future relations between your firm and ourselves should any occasion arise when your assistance would be required in connection with the Kenya and Uganda Railway.

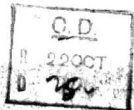

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter No.18239/32 of the 29th July transmitting a copy of a despatch from the High Commissioner for Transport suggesting the reduction of the remuneration paid to Messrs.Rendel, Palmer and Tritton for advising on the schemes referred to them in connection with new construction work on the Kenya and Uganda Railway.

2. We have discussed the matter with the Consulting Engineers, who have now agreed that the annual retaining fee paid to them by the Kenya and Uganda Railway may be reduced from £500 to £100 per annum, provided that, when any major works are undertaken and their services are required, a suitable fee in addition to the retainer will be paid for such work. If the above reduction is agreed to we assume that payment of the reduced amount will date from January 1st next.

3. We should like to point out that in recent years questions affecting the strength of viaducts and bridges on the Kenya and Uganda Railway have been referred to Messrs.Rendel, Palmer and Tritton on the instructions of the Railway Department, although the work involved could have been conveniently dealt with by our own staff and would have been so dealt with for any other Colonial Railway.

I have the honour to refer to Mr Amery's despatch KENYA No.250 of the 5th March, 1926, in which he approved the payment of a retaining fee of £500 a year to Messrs Rendel, Palmer and Tritton as Consulting Engineers by this Administration for work connected with the location of new lines, survey plans and estimates, and special work such as investigations into viaducts and other important or difficult schemes.

2. In view of the existing conditions, I consider that only a minimum of work of the above nature will be carried out by this Administration during the next 4 or 5 years and owing to the need for economy in every item of expenditure, I suggest that the Crown Agents should approach Messrs Rendel, Palmer and Tritton to ascertain whether their retaining fee could not be reduced to a nominal sum only during the next few years, when it is probable that they will be doing only a very minor amount of work on behalf of this Administration; should conditions change and any major works be in contemplation, this matter could then be readjusted.

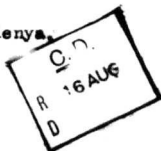

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that Simon Achola, a Telegraph Messenger in the Post and Telegraphs Department, has been allowed to retire from the Service on medical grounds and the Postmaster General recommends that a break in his service from the 19th December, 1921, to the 30th April, 1922, should be treated as leave without pay and that he should be awarded a gratuity in respect of his service from the 1st September, 1907.

2.
