wages, the actual amount paid being decided after consultation with the Native Affairs Department.

At present there is no Workmen's Compensat-4 . ion Act in these Territories, but it appears that the Governments of Kenya and Uganda contemplate passing such legislation in the near future and that under the legislation contemplated this Administration might in the resent case be liable to say compensation to the extent of two years' salary, which would amount to £120.

In view of the above, I consider that the 5. dependants of the late Mr Fernandes should be treated on the same basis as has been the custom in the case of African servants, and as might become customary if a Workmen's Compensation Act were brought into force in Kenya and Ugenda-I accordingly recommend, for your approval, that a further award may be made to the dependents of Mr D.G.Fernandes of 2100, bringing up the total amount, including the £20 gratuity already paid, to the equivalent of two years? salary.
