It is much better to delete from the
draft Bill all reference to the private arrange-
ment as to the subsequent transfer of the property,
and we can certainly accept that amendment.

I agree that it is desirable to include
in the Bill that the revocation of the Trust Deed
shall take effect from the date of the conveyance of
the real property, as suggested by Mr. Roberts-Wray
in his minute of 11.3.32.

As to the fifth paragraph of the letter
from Messrs. Goodman, Brown and Company, they appear
to have made a mistake in the figure. The papers
show the amount involved to be £255.5.9. The
correspondence in file No.C.T. 15485/25 Gen. Kenya,
is important in connection with their enquiry.
It will be seen from (25) on that file that a
miscellaneous collection of German Missions' property
was sold by the Custodian of Enemy Property. And the
amount now under discussion represents the balance
left after personal claims had been satisfied, and
is thus, in origin, the property of the Leipzig
Lutheran Mission.

The Secretary of State authorised the
handing over of this sum to the African Inland
Mission Trust, Limited, in their capacity as
Trustees of the German Missions' property in accord-
ance with clause 1 of the Trust Deed. The legal
position therefore is that so long as the Trust
Deed continues to be in force, the Trustees must use
the money for the purposes of the Trust. If any
of the money remains unspent at the date of the
revocation of the Deed, it would seem to form part
of the property which is to revert to the Leipzig
Lutheran Mission under clause 2 of the draft Bill,
although

although, of course, its disposal may be subject to any private arrangement which may be arrived at between the two parties concerned.

Mr Roberts Wray discussed today with
Mr Brown of Goodman Brown & Co, the
suggested amendments to his latest draft
Ordinance.

As regards the time when the Ordinance
is to come into effect, Mr Brown states
that his clients were prepared to see
the Ordinance operate immediately.



Preamble.

WHEREAS by Article 458 of the Treaty of Peace between the Allied and Associated Powers and Germany signed at Versailles on the Twenty-eighth day of June One thousand nine hundred and nineteen it is provided and agreed that where Christian religious missions were being maintained by German Societies or persons in territory belonging to any one of the Allied and Associated Powers the property which such missions or Missionary Societies possessed should continue to be devoted to Missionary purposes and that in order to ensure the due execution of this undertaking the Allied and Associated Governments would hand over such property to Boards of Trustees to be appointed by or approved by the Governments and composed of persons holding the faith of the Mission whose property is involved:

AND WHEREAS certain property in the Colony was being maintained by German Societies or persons for Missionary purposes and the said property is by the German Missions Ordinance, 1924, vested in such trustees and upon such trusts as the Secretary of State may appoint and determine:

AND WHEREAS the said German Missions Ordinance, 1924, was repealed by the German Missions (Repeal) Ordinance, 1951;

AND WHEREAS by an Agreement made on or about the 12th day of November 1950, between the Trustees of the one part and the Leipzig Lutheran Mission of the other part, the Trustees consented, inter alia, to the said Deed dated the 30th day of September, 1926, being revoked;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to empower the parties to the said Agreement to give effect to the said Agreement:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

- Short title.**
- Revesting of certain mission property.
1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the German Mission (Revesting) Ordinance, 1952".
 2. All property in the Colony, whether movable or immovable, which is now vested in the Trustees and is or represents property which became vested in Trustees under and by virtue of the provisions of Section 3 of the German Missions Ordinance, 1924, and which immediately before it became vested in a custodian of enemy property, or on the 10th

day of June, 1920, belonged to or was held in trust for
the Leipzig Lutheran Mission, shall by virtue of this
Ordinance, be vested in the said Leipzig Lutheran
Mission.

3. This Ordinance shall operate as a complete
release and discharge of the Trustees in respect of any
acts, omissions or liability on the part of them or their
agents relating to the property mentioned in section 2
of this Ordinance.

I have read the Secretary of State's despatch Kenya Confidential (2) dated the 31st May and I agree that in the circumstances disclosed in the correspondence forwarded under cover of that despatch the amendments appear reasonable and such as this Government can accept.

I am unable however to appreciate the meaning of the second paragraph of the despatch. If the Bill had remained unchanged I agree that such an additional clause as is suggested could have been necessary to determine the trust, but as the amendments to the Bill have the effect of deleting all reference to the conveyance of the trust land and buildings to the Africa Inland Mission Trust Limited, and as the Bill in its present form provides that the property shall vest in the Leipzig Lutheran Mission I do not understand what conveyance is referred to in the paragraph in question, and I shall be glad if you will refer the matter to the Secretary of State for further instructions.



We refer to your letter to us of the 10th January last and to our subsequent interview when the question of amending the Draft Bill was discussed. We are now able to return the latter approved on behalf of our Clients, the Africa Inland Mission and the Africa Inland Mission Trust Ltd as amended in red.

A B I L L
RELATING TO THE RE-TRANSFER OF PROPERTY TO A
CERTAIN GERMAN MISSION.

Preamble.

WHEREAS by Article 455 of the Treaty of Peace between the Allied and Associated Powers and Germany signed at Versailles on the twenty-eighth day of June One thousand nine hundred and nineteen it is provided and agreed that where Christian religious missions were being maintained by German Societies or persons in territory belonging to any one of the Allied and Associated Powers the property which such Missions or Missionary Societies possessed should continue to be devoted to Missionary purposes and that in order to ensure the due execution of this undertaking the Allied and Associated Governments would hand over such property to Boards of Trustees to be appointed by or approved by the Governments and composed of persons holding the faith of the Mission whose property is involved;

AND WHEREAS certain property in the Colony was being maintained by German Societies or persons for Missionary purposes and the said property is by the German Missions Ordinance, 1924, vested in such trustees and upon such trusts as the Secretary of State may appoint and determine;

AND WHEREAS by a Deed made the Thirtieth day of September one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six between the Secretary of State of the one part and the Africa Inland Mission Trust Limited of 80 John Street Bedford Row in the County of London of the other part, the Secretary of State in exercise of the powers vested in him by the said German Missions Ordinance, 1924, appointed the said Africa Inland Mission Trust Limited

as a Trustee and directed that the said Africa Inland Mission Trust Limited should hold the property in the Colony of the Leipzig Evangelical Mission upon and for the trusts and purposes therein set forth:

AND WHEREAS the said German Missions Ordinance, 1904, was repealed by the German Missions (Repeal) Ordinance, 1931;

AND WHEREAS on or about the 12th day of November 1930, between the said Africa Inland Mission Trust Limited of the one part and the Leipzig Lutheran Mission of the other part, the said Africa Inland Mission Trust Limited consented, inter alia, to the said Deed dated the 30th day of September 1926, being revoked, and the Leipzig Lutheran Mission agreed, inter alia, after the revocation of the said Deed, to execute whatever document that may be necessary to transfer the land and buildings, the subject of the said Deed, to the Africa Inland Mission Trust Limited:

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to confirm the parties to the said Agreement to give effect to the said Agreement.

IT IS THEREFORE ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:-

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "the German Mission (Reverting) Ordinance, 1932".

2. All property in the Colony, whether movable or immovable, which became vested in Trustees under law by virtue of the provisions of Section 3 of the German Missions Ordinance, 1904, and which immediately before it became vested in a custodian of enemy property, or on the 10th day of June, 1920, belonged to persons held in trust for the Leipzig Lutheran

Mission, shall by virtue of this Ordinance, be vested
in the said Leipzig Lutheran Mission.

5. It is deemed as may be convenient and practicable
after the date of the coming into operation of this
Ordinance the said Leipzig Lutheran Mission shall transfer
all such property to the Africa Inland Mission in
accordance with the terms and conditions of the said
Agreement dated the 12th day of November
1930, and such other terms and conditions as may be
agreed upon.

6. This Ordinance shall operate as a complete
relief and discharge of the trustees in whom all such
property was vested under and by virtue of the provisions
of Section 5 of the German Missions Ordinance in respect
of any note, omission or liability on the part of them
or their agents relating to such property.

~~OBJECTS AND REASONS.~~

The objects and reasons for this Bill are
detailed in its preamble.

No expenditure of public money will be
involved in the provisions of this Bill before law.
