State has Mr. Maitland's pension, which ceased on her remarriage in 1904, has been restored to her; propose, subject to concurrence, to recover the share charged to Colonial funds, from Crown Agent, quarterly.

We accepted a charge of £90.7.2 - the C.O. share of Mrs. Maitland's pension in 1907.

(See 219 of 1907 and 41384 of 1906 - flagged).

Now that her pension has been restored I presume that Kenya should pay a share again.

In 1907 Mrs. Maitland's pension was apportioned: as she is now only 61 it might be cheaper to do so now instead of making quarterly payments. However I suppose that the C.O. will take this into account.

Reply accepting the charge, agree with the proposed method of recovery & state that the C.O. have been notified. Copy of correspondence to Gov. Kenya for his info and to C.O. for necessary action.

With reference to the correspondence ending with the letter from your Office dated 26th February 1931, No. 17087/31 in regard to the case of Mrs. M.F. Cartwright, I am directed to inform you that the Secretary of State in Council has now decided that the restoration of Mrs. Cartwright's Royal Warrant pension of £180 a year shall have effect from the 8th January 1928.

Mrs. Cartwright's second husband - the Reverend S.F. Cartwright-died on 20th September 1927, and under the rules of Royal Warrant Mrs. Cartwright would have been eligible for the restoration of her pension as the widow of Lieutenant Colonel Maitland, I.M.S., with effect from that date. She, however, did not apply for the pension to be restored until 8th January 1931 and, in accordance with the usual practice in such cases, she was re-admitted to pension with effect from the date of her application. Subsequently Mrs. Cartwright applied for the arrears of pension to be granted to her and three years arrears have now been allowed.

It is presumed that in the above circumstances no objection will be taken by your Department to claims in respect of Mrs. Cartwright's pension, at the rate of £90.7.2 a year, being made in the accounts with the Crown Agents for the Colonies, with effect from 8th January 1928 instead of

Sir,

I am directed to refer to the correspondence ending with the letter from your office dated 4th January 1907, No. 219, in regard to a claim by this Department for a share of the cost of the Royal Warrant pension of Mrs. M.L.Maitland, widow of Lieut. Col. C.B.Maitland, I.M.S., killed in action on 16th February 1901 when on service under your Department in Jubaland, and to inform you that Mrs. Maitland's pension, which ceased on her remarriage on 18th January 1904, has now been restored at the original rate of £180 a year with effect from 8th January 1931, following the death of her second husband, the Revd. S.F. Cartwright.

In the correspondence above referred to your Department accepted a charge for a service share (.004) of the ordinary portion (£90 a year) of Mrs. Maitland's pension and for the whole of the balance, or extraordinary portion of the pension, and a capitalized charge on this basis for the period of the currency of the pension was met, under your Department's instructions, by the Crown Agents for the Colonies. In view of the restoration of the pension to Mrs. Cartwright a further charge is due against your Department, at the original rate of £90.7.2 a year, with effect from 8th January 1931, and, subject to your concurrence, it is proposed, in this instance, to make the necessary recoveries quarterly from the Crown Agents as each issue of the pension is made.
