called twice this week, bringing with him on  
the second occasion (yesterday evening) Mrs.  
Stevenson, the mother of the two children.  
Mrs. S., who is returning to Kenya by the  
Mombasa Castle today, gave us emphatically  
to understand that she has every intention  
of remaining in loco parentis to the children,  
and will undertake the various liabilities  
(responsibility for holidays and for ultimate  
disposal when they leave) which the Orphanage  
authorities want. It was agreed that  
efforts should now be made for the  
children to leave Kenya in December & to  
be admitted to Wanders at the beginning  
of January next.

setting out the Orphanage's requirements, in

send out to O.A.S. by next week's  
Air Mail.
