I have the honour to refer to your Confidential
 No. 34 2700/32 despatch dated the 15th January, 1933. I have deferred
 my final conclusion on the question of issuing written
 instructions to define the position and status of the
 Chief Native Commissioner until such time as the Report
 of the Expenditure Advisory Committee became available.
 Copies of that Report were forwarded to you under cover
 of Third Personal Note dated the 8th March, 1933, and
 Nos. 3109/33 you will observe from paragraphs Nos. 367-377 that the
 Committee has made recommendations involving a closer
 association of the Chief Native Commissioner's Office with
 the central organization of the Secretariat. The recommenda-
 tions of the Committee are now under consideration, and
 since the form of any instructions defining the position
 and status of the Chief Native Commissioner must depend
 to some extent on the position held by him in relation to
 whatever organization of the Secretariat may be finally
 adopted, I propose to defer my final conclusion on the
 question of such instructions until such time as I am in
 a position to forward to you my final recommendations for
 the reorganization of the Secretariat. I trust that this
 course will meet with your approval.
