As the pupil's parente (Mr.Pellys' brother and sister-in-law) are still very much distressed, it is desired that any news we may receive from Government should be communicated to the uncle and not to them.

#### SUSPECTED CASE OF MURDER

#### Victim of Savage Tribal Rite

NAIROBI, Dec. 9.

The finding of a white man's skull, which is believed to have been for some time in possession of warriors of the Samburu tribe, whose territory borders on the settled district of Laikipa, Kenya, may lead to a solution of the mysterious death two years ago of the young Eng-lishman, Theodore Powys.

Mr. Powys, whose home was at Dorchester, was employed as farm manager by Lady Eleanor Cole. He dis-appeared on October 19, 1931, after set-ting out one morning on horseback in search of pasturage.

His pony later returned to the farm

His pony later returned to the same riderless, and a search, in which scores of settlers took pert, was at once begun. Portions of Mr. Powys body were discovered, but the fact that the head remained missing cast doubt upon the scopped theory that he had been killed by
