lease is essential for the people  
carrying out a scheme.

No doubt the Indians are  
fully ready for the Indians  
to have the land now. But  
is it certain that in 1997 they  
will be equally wealthy as it  
again in 1997? It seems to

we start whatever the feelings of  
the natives may be now it is  
contrary to the intention of the  
Act that 99 year leases  
shall be given unless condition  
(2) above is fulfilled.

I would therefore enquire  
further on the point before  
approving.

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that at a meeting of the Central Board under the Native Lands Trust Ordinance, held at Government House on the 30th July, 1931, I ordered, with the advice and consent of the Board, that:

"the areas of 40.1 acres, known as L.R.No. 1194, and of 1.63 acres, known as L.R.No. 1195, in the Sagalla Native Reserve, be leased to the Church Missionary Society for a period of 33 years from the 1st January, 1931, at a peppercorn rental."

2. This order gives effect to approval granted provisionally by Sir Jacob Marts when acting as Governor in 1928, and before the introduction of the Native Lands Trust Ordinance. The plots were in fact purchased by the Church Missionary Society from natives many years ago (one in 1902), but the Society is now willing to exchange their native titles for leases.

3. I further ordered, with the advice and consent of the Board, that a recommendation should be made to you to the effect that this lease for 33 years be increased to 99 years on the spot and that this latter period was agreed to by the local natives concerned before the passing of the Native Lands Trust Ordinance.

4. In view of Section 9(1) of that Ordinance your prior consent to this increase is necessary and this recommendation is therefore submitted for your approval.


