In view of this telegram it will, I imagine, be agreed to submit Mr. Stooke for the appointment of Deputy Treasurer in Kenya which will be vacant in March next. selection for so important a post after less than three years' Treasury experience will, no doubt, be a disappointment to useful officers of much longer standing in the Treasury service, such as Mr. A. Muchmore of Tanganyika. But Mr. Stooke is definitely of the time likely to train on into a Financial Adviser for an important Colonial Government; he showed during his earlier service in Kenya (1925 - 1933) ability to get en with weefficials and an aptitude for Council and Committee work - a quality to which Sir J. Byrne attaches so much importance (see North). I doubt whether anyone in the list of candidates on 1046 Promotions could rival him in that respect, with the possible exception of Mr. Adshead of Uganda and he has no practical Treasury experience.

It will be seen from Mr. Stocke's

Promotions file that he applied in July last for
a Secretarist appointment; also Mr. Vatta, the

Treasurer in Mauritius, in the letter reproduced
in the attached particulars, said that he
imagined that that officer hoped to get back to
