With reference to paragraph 4 of Sir Edward Grigg's Confidential despatch No.16 of the 14th June, 1926, and to Mr. Moore's Confidential despatch No. 77 of the 16th, June, 1933, on the subject of compensation for the demolition of Railway houses in the area between Fifth Avenue, Government Road, Whitehouse Road and the Railway line, I have the honour to inform you that at a meeting of the Standing Finance Committee held on 22ml December, 1934, proposals were considered for the lay-out of the City Square surrounding the new Law Courts building.

2. The proposals approved by the Standing Finance Committee held on 25ml

2. The proposals approved by the Standing Finance Committee include the demolition of twelve more Railway houses in this area and compensation to the Railway for the removal of these houses has been agreed upon by the Director of Public Works and the General Manager, Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours, at £2,400.

3. The total cost of all the works entailed in laying out the area, including the compensation for these twelve houses has been approved by the Standing Finance Committee as follows:

- The sum payable to the Kenya and Ugarda
  Railways and Harbours Administration for the demolition of
  buildings will be ultimately recoverable from the sales of
  plots in this area and the Standing Finance Committee have
  advised that these plots should be offered for sale on
  conditions which would depart from the present formula and
  permit the purchaser to pay the whole or the greater portion of the value in cash rather than by way of rent, and
  that this procedure should be followed in dealing with the
  plots in City Square area until the full amount of
  compensation due to the Railway for the removal of all their
  houses, and so clearing the land for sale is realised.

It is hoped to recover in this way the payments under reference in this despatch and also further payments which will be due to the Kenya and Uganda Railways and Harbours Administration for the removal of other buildings from the sale of some plots in Fifth Avenue during 1935.

7. I would therefore ask for your sanction by telegram for two sums, one of £1,679 as compensation to the Railway and one of £4,178 for the necessary construction work to be included in the first supplementary estimates.
