I am commanded by the Air Council to acquaint you for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that difficulty is being experienced in obtaining adequate supporting vouchers in respect of expenditure incurred by the Government of Kenya on the construction of temporary barrack accommodation ac. for the Royal Air Force Unit which was despatched to that territory in connection with the Italo-Abyssinian emergency.

The only supporting documents that have been received so far are itemised statements of expenditure and the Air Council understand that it has not been possible to obtain accounts in a form which would meet the requirements of the Comptroller and Auditor General.

The Air council believe that, in somewhat similar circumstances, the certificate of the Colonial Audit pepartment has been accepted in support of expenditure incurred on behalf of other Government departments and would be grateful if, provided Er. Secretary Ormsby-Core sees no objection, arrangements could be made between the local representative of the Director of Colonial Audit and the Air Einistry Auditor in the Middle East Command for the examination and certification of the expenditure now in question and any similar charges that may arise in the future.
