I have been waiting to answer your letters about Jenner's grave at Kismayu hoping that I might in course of time have something to tell you. I am afraid, however, I still have no information. We arranged with our air people who might go to Kismayu to try and find something out about the grave at the time when there was a certain amount of commercial communication between Kismayu and Nairobi. One pilot made two visits some time ago but, so far as I can make out, he was not allowed into the part of the town where Jenner's grave is. Anyhow, he brought back no information. His visits now appear to have ceased, and I do not think that I am very likely to get any information. When things in that part of the world have settled down a bit I will probably get hold of our Italian Consul and see if I can get any news through him.
