Thank you for your letter of November 26. I am glad to learn that my offer with reference to bringing two soil erosion officers from Kenya and Uganda to the U.S.A. has met with your approval. I have written to Mr. H. H. Bennett, Director of the U.S. Soil Conservation Service, asking for cooperation in the project, which I am sure will be forthcoming. When I have definite word from him, I will inform you.

With reference to the two officers coming over together on a joint visit, while we would probably not make this a controlling condition, nevertheless I do hope that arrangements can be made for them to come together, because I am sure that each one would get much more out of the trip than if they came separately. Close association on such a trip and opportunity for full discussion as they went along seem to me to be highly desirable.
