Regulation 275 of the Kenya Code of Regulations provides that operations upon an officer will be performed free provided that they are not necessitated by his own indiscretion, but operations upon members of his family or household and attendance at accouchments may be charged for. The cest of any treatment which a Government Medical Service is unable to provide will be borne by the officer concerne in cases, however, where such treatment is necessary and expensive; the grant of ex gratia assistance may be considered.

Hospital fees on the following scale will be chargeable for an officer and his wife and children lodged in European hospitals:-

Mr. W.G. Howe is on £500 a year, and Mr. H.H.Rogers £540 a year. In the circumstances ? approve the payment of Shs. 1288/- to the Maia Carberry Nursing Home.
