Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that Mr. Yusuf Mousa Daudy, an African serving on Asian terms of service as an old Second Grade Clerk in the Provincial Administration, has been compulsorily retired on completion of thirty years' service.

2. Mr. Daudy who was originally engaged as a Native Agent and Hut Counter on the 15th August, 1908, was transferred to the clerical establishment on the 10th September, 1919. His services have been continuous and having regard to Lord Passfield's despatch No. 774 of the 3rd October, 1929, I recommend that for purposes of pension under the Superannuation Acts his services may be allowed to count from the 10th August, 1908.

3. I enclose a Form of Particulars in respect of pension payable to Mr. Daudy amounting to £108.12.0 per annum. This computation is based on the assumption that you will approve my recommendation.

Sir,

I have the honour to recommend for your approval that Ngabilii Ole Masikonue and Parsiloi Ole Galishu, Headmen in the Masai District, who have retired from the Service, should each be granted compassionate gratuities equivalent to a year's salary, viz. Sh.1,800/- and Sh.900/- respectively. This recommendation is made owing to the absence of complete records of their past services, for which reason the Financial Secretary does not consider that their gratuities can properly be related directly to Section 900 of the Code of Regulations.

Although Ngabilii Ole Masikonue was not actually gazetted under the Native Authority Ordinance until 1918, it is on record that Mr. (later Sir Frederick) Jackson wrote while in England on the 22nd February 1904 referring to him as "the principal Chief at Naivasha", and there is also evidence that he was acting as a Chief at the beginning of the century.

Parsiloi Ole Galishu was gazetted on the same date. He was, however, referred to in August 1904 as one of the Masai Chiefs who were present at Naivasha to meet Sir Donald Stewart in connection with the first treaty. As a result of a disagreement with the District Commissioner, Narok, on the question of the

I have the honour to state that subject to your approval I have authorised the grant of a compassionate gratuity equivalent to one year's wages viz: Sh.120/- to Bawa Ranja, an Indian Sweeper, who claims to have served as follows:-

- (a) Jemadar at Mombasa Old Harbour from 1898 to 1902 at a monthly wage of Rs.50/- when he was transferred to the Railway Department at the request of the latter;
- (b) Jemadar, Kenya and Uganda Railways at Mombasa from 1903 to 1910 at a monthly wage of Rs.15/-. Before the war he proceeded on six months' leave to India with full pay;
- (c) Sweeper at District Headquarters, Kyambu, from 1910 to 1924 at a salary of Rs.60/- per mensem when he resigned voluntarily on account of illness;
- (d) Official Sweeper to the Assistant Inspector of Police and Police Lines at Galga from the 1st January, 1930, to date. Wages Sh.10/- per mensem.

2. In a representation made on behalf of Bawa Ranja the District Commissioner, Nakuru, states as follows:-

"Bawa has lived and worked in this country for some 40 years; his present age is doubtful, but he is well over 70 years, and may be over 80.

He

He is so frail that it appears as if he might die any day. Nevertheless, as he has absolutely no relatives, and no property or private means, he has to continue working to live.

At the end of this long period of menial service to Government Departments, the Railway etc., he finds himself in abject poverty and still obliged to work.

I submit that this is a case pre-eminently deserving special consideration. The compassionate grant of Sh.10/- per month if made would more than suffice to pay his rent, which he is at present in arrears, and which is a constant source of anxiety to him."

3. It is obviously impossible to verify all the details given in paragraph 1 above, hence my recommendation for the award of a compassionate grant of Sh.120/- to Bawa Ranja. This amount will be deposited with the District Commissioner, Nakuru, and paid out to Bawa Ranja in the form of a monthly allowance of Sh.5/- or Sh.10/- at the discretion of the District Commissioner.

Had they retired at that date they would not have been eligible for gratuities and their case appears, therefore, to be similar to that of Mr. R. C. Bird, late Surveyor, Public Works Department, referred to in Mr. Thomas's despatch No. 297 of the 8th May, 1936.

3. As in the case of Mr. Bird, the gratuities of these watchmen have been computed on the mean emoluments drawn by them and amount to Sh. 330/- and Sh. 340/- respectively and in accordance with the ruling contained in the last paragraph of that despatch I refer these cases to you for your approval.
