With reference to despatch No. 339 of Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister (now Viscount Swinton) dated the 2nd May, 1934, I have the honour to summit my views respecting the appointment of a Member of Legislative Council to represent the interests of the Arab Community, as provided under Clause IV of the Instructions passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet dated the 29th March, 1934.

2. As you are aware, these interests were originally represented by Sheikh Ali bin Salim, K.B.E., C.M.G., who sat as a Mominated Official Member, in accordance with the provisions of Clause I of the Additional Instructions passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet dated the 28th March, 1927, until his retirement from the public service of the Colony in the year 1931. Subsequently, the officer helding the post of Provincial Commissioner for the Coast was specially appointed to represent the interests of the Arab Community under the provisions of the same Clause.

3. As a consequence of representations made by my predecessor, Sir Joseph Byrne, in his

Confidential despatch No. 56 of the 6th April, 1934. approval was accorded in Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister's Telegram No. 102 dated the 17th April, 1934, to the appointment of Sheikh Ali bin Salim, K.B.E., C.M.G., as a Nominated Unofficial Member of Legislative Council to represent the interests of the Arab Community, under Clause XIX of the Instructions passed under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet dated the 29th March, 1934. Sheikh Ali bin Salim represented those interests up to the date of the dissolution of the last Council. During the present election, however, he stood for the Arab seat on the Legislative Council and was returned unopposed and is, therefore, no longer qualified to be nominated.

- I would have preferred this seat to continue to be held by an Arab but, after full consideration, I have reached the conclusion that there is, at present, no Arab, official or unofficial, whom I can recommend for membership of Council. In these circumstances, I would recommend the revival of the practice of amointing the officer holding the post of Provincial Commissioner for the Coast to represent the interests of the Arab Community, in accordance with Clause XV of the Phove-quoted Instructions.
- the Coast is Mr. George Henry Carne Boulderson, whose appointment definitely as a Nominated Official Member of the Legislative Council has already been recommended in my despatch No.175 of the 26th March, 1938.

(I have been scratching my nead a good deal over the Members for Native Interests on the new Legislative Council. Montgomery is of course an obvious candidate for one seat, but the only drawback is that he has been so recently a Chief Native Commissioner and may rather cramp the style of his successor in this post. Whoever fills this first seat will be the Member on Executive Council. The second seat I want to keep for a missionary, partly because I feel they ought to be represented owing to the good work they are doing, and also because being nominally at any rate a Christian Government, I feel we ought to have an official of the Church on our Legislative Council. But at present I have been quite unable to find a man who will fill the bill. Some of them, like Burns and Owen, are too old. There are one or two good people in the 3cotch Church, but the difficulty there is that if I appointed one of them the Kikuyu might believe that Government intended to introduce some drastic action in regard to female circumcision. The Methodists are too femand live too far off; if I took one of them it would completely upset the work of their missions. The C. M. S. have got nobody of the type I want - broadminded and active in brain and body. A Roman Cathelic is definitely a possibility. there would be an outery about it amongst certain classes here and in England, but after all they have done good work out here and I don't think it will do any harm to the C. M. S. to have a bit of a jolt; at present they are somewhat selfself-satisfied and don't realise what a vast_field there is for more activity.

7. I have been spending the time before the rains going round different native reserves. The Kikuyu in the Kiambu area are very flourishing, but show signs of becoming troublesome. There is a good deal of anti-European feeling, though not specially anti-Government. At a baraza I held they asked for many silly things, such as a native member on Legislative Council, and they got a very definite No.
