In paragraph 4 of a confidential despatch of the lat of May, ASC: (No. 7 on 16157.53 Tiangle the Secretary of State gave instructions shat a statement of all permits applied for and grantes to collect money from natives should be furnished ever six months. In this despatch the Governor asks whether the submission of these statements may be discontinued.

The history behind the 1931 instructions is briefly as follows. In 1930 the activities of the Kikuyu Central Association were causing embarrassment to Government. The methods for pursuing

oursaing these activities include the offecting of funds, ostensibly for unobjectionable purposes, for use in stirring up dissatisfaction. It was thought by Government that if the K.C.A. was compelled publish an account of the manner in which the whites raised were spent, the Association's leaders yould be discredited in the public The Covernor ove and their power diminished. accordingly issued directions whereby a permit was required for collecting money from netives. Instructions were also issued by Secretariat Circular (see No. 10 in Tol. 7 Sy rlagged) that Contain conditions were to be rail tiled before the persits were granted.
