I have the honour to transmit a form of

and conditions laid down for the Kenya European
Local Civil Service which has become vacant
consequent on the termination of the services of
Mr. B.M. Fuller and to request that the Crown Agents
for the Colonies may be asked to engage a suitable

order to arrive not later than June next.

2. The Conservator of Forests prefers an
unmarried man of 22 to 25 years of age who has
passed through one of the Forestry Commissions
schools in England or Scotland and has had, if
possible, some experience of practical forest work
with the Commission.

3. In regard to the salary to be paid to the
successful applicant, it is suggested that if, in
addition to passing through the Forestry
Commissions' School, the applicant has also had
considerable practical experience with the
Commission and is, say, not less than 25 years of
age, he should be engaged at the minimum salary for
Grade I, viz. £360 per annum. A younger and less
experienced candidate should be engaged at the
minimum salary for Grade II, viz. £240 per annum,

A sound knowledge of practical forest work, including nursery work, the formation of plantations and their tending, thinning & pruning, measurements of all classes of timber & firewood, simple measurement of land, fire control, management of labour, etc.

3. Allowances, quarters, and other circumstances affecting the value of the Office, including grant of free or assisted passages to the Officer and his family on first appointment and on leave.
4. Nature, number, and amount of securities required, and mode of giving them.

According to qualifications Grade I £560-20-480-20-540 or Grade II £240-20-~~60~~-560 with prospect of promotion to Grade I. Non-Pensionable.

Local Civil Service terms as laid down in Secretariat Circular No.2 of 28/1/35.

Free passage on first appointment.

5. Acts, Laws, or Ordinances, making provision respecting any of the above matters with reference to the sections in which such provision is made.

Furnished quarters available for which rent is payable in accordance with the regulations or alternatively a tent or other temporary accommodation. No furniture to be brought from England.

6. Whether house accommodation is available or readily procurable, whether furniture, etc. should be brought from England, and any other particulars of a like nature likely to be useful for the information of candidates.

Free medical attendance and free medicines when prescribed by an officer of the Medical Department.

7. Whether free medical attendance and medicines are provided.
