I agree that the establishment and equipment of a small laboratory at Naivasha is desirable. The change in the programme of work was clearly set out in the documents submitted to the C.D.A.C. registered as No.17 in 23157/34. The

proposal is to utilize a sum of £800 savings from the earlier grant for the necessary capital expenditure. The estimates for the new grant, - i.e. from April 1st, 1935, - and submitted with despatch registered as No.1 in 23157/34, do not show any provision for either the erection and equipment of a laboratory or for its maintenance, unless the recurrent expenditure on the laboratory is to be charged to the vote of £500 for the upkeep of the Farm or to the vote of £100 for incidentals.

I therefore feel that it would be preferable to seek the approval of the C.D.A.C. for the utilization of savings from the earlier grant for the cepital expenditure envisaged on the understanding that any recurrent expenditure on maintenance will be met from the new grants which were authorized by the Pressury on August 17 1934 (No.25 in 23157/34).

As stated by Mr. Freeston, the Comptroller and Auditor-General may have drawn a wrong inference from paragraph (2) of my report on the G.D.F. statement of receipts and expenditure for the year 1983/34. The extract from the Auditor's covering letter which I quoted did not mean that the final expenditure under Scheme No. 208 had not been audited. It that the expenditure recorded under that as in the 0.D.T. statement and in the books of the Colemy (see pare 11 of Circ. of 21.11.50 was morely the payment of the grant by the Treasurer to the Director of Agriculture. 3. So I think that all the C.O. need do is to forward to the Treasury the audited statements of the Naivasha Farm Fund for 1932-3 and 1933-4 with some excuse for not having sent them before and explain to the Treasury as in para. I above.

I would not go here into the question of how the C. & A.A. can be satisfied in the case of expenditure by outside bedies which the Auditor in the Colony cannot examine. In this case the Auditor both can examine, and has examined, the expenditure and has certified the relevant accounts; and, if the C. & A.G. isn't satisfied when he has been furnished with those certified accounts, he can say that more he does want.

### Naivasha Farm Fund Account.

I return herewith duly certified the statements in respect of the Naivasha Farm Fund Account and the Naivasha Farm Operating Account.

- 2. As regards the latter account I am unable to certify that the figures shown on the expenditure side are correctly allocated to the sub-heads specified, as it is impossible to verify from the only book of account kept i.e. a badly kept cash book, what each payment represented. It is probable that in the item "Foodstuffs" certain sums have been included which should have gone to "Equipment etc."
- 3. As stated above the system of accounts kept by the Farm consists of a small cash book only and although I do not want to suggest any elaborate system it would in my opinion be helpful to all concerned if an analysed cash book ruled into columns on the lines adopted by the Accountant of your department for the year 1934, were put into use.
- 4. True revenue and expenditure figures are not reflected in the account as submitted, owing to the practice of crediting net amounts only. As an example of my meaning I would quote the case of the Creamery who pay, monthly, certain sums in respect of milk, butter fat etc. From the amount due to the far, the Creamery deduct the cost of cattle

cake etc. purchased from them by the farm, and the net amount only is shown in the farm cash book as a credit. Therefore the item "Butterfat and milk", on the Receipt side of the account and the item "Foodstuffs" on the Expenditure side do not represent true figures.

5. I would suggest that your Accountant be permitted to visit the farm and go into the whole question there with a view to putting the farm accounts on a more satisfactory footing.
