since the election of March last.
As to the original appointment (no 4

on X 10050/2) the Govt could & have saved a
lot of trouble by accepting the proposal
provisionally & then requesting that H.M.
should approve the provisional appoint &
should definitively appoint them. The
procedure as to the later definitive appoint
(class B) appears correct.

As regards the provisional & temporary
appoint, it seems that in class A the
substantially correct - apart from the fact
that the Govt "requests the T.O.F. to
accede his sanction" or "requests covering
approval" instead of "requesting H.M.'s
confirmation". In class C (the
last telegram) he falls into the error
of which we were warned as in no. 2 on
X 1772/26.

I do not know whether it will be
right to write to say anything as to

sent was technically incorrect or unnecessary

there is something to be said for our
knowing beforehand who is to be on



A. Actual Procedure adopted.

I. Provisional Appointments.

The Governor reports the provisional appointment of Mr. E. A. Newthwaite, Canon Lessoway and Major Kant-Lemon to be temporarily Nominated Official Members, and requests that the Secretary of State will accord his sanction.


